


**ORDER: SPREAD ON THE MINUTES THE ORDER APPOINTING MAE

COMMISSIONER BY THE CHANCERY COURT OF LAFAYETTE COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI


ORDER APPOINTING JURY COMMISSIONER

WHEREAS, the regular 1974 session of the Legislature of the State of Mississippi provided by Chapter 378 of the General Laws of 1974 that a jury selection commission be appointed in each county of the state of Mississippi, and;

WHEREAS, the provision of Section 3 of said Act and particularly Section 13-5-6 of the Mississippi Code of 1972 required the appointments be made, one by the Circuit Judge, one by the Chancery Judge and one by the Board of Supervisors, of each county in the particular district of each Judge or Senior Judge.

NOW, therefore be and it is hereby ordered by the Chancery Court of Lafayette County Mississippi, that Mae Frances Shelby, who is duly qualified as an elector and resident citizen in said county, and not an attorney for an elected public official, thus meeting the qualifications of the law, be and is hereby appointed as Jury Commissioner of said County for a term of (4) four years, beginning and being effective the 1<sup>st</sup> day of January, 2016, and she shall on or before said date, or before performing any official duties as Jury Commissioner take the general oath of office required of public officials and file same with the Chancery Clerk of Lafayette County.

SO ORDERED this the 29<sup>th</sup> day of December, 2015, and placed upon the minutes of the Court by the Clerk of Lafayette County, Mississippi.
