Board of Supervisors:

Since our initial meeting nearly a year ago, we have conducted an extensive Site Analysis and have been working with various Federal and State agencies to gain approval and support for the development.

Federal:

Corps of engineers approval for over 200 acres of lakes. Establishing a Federal Conservation Easement of over 200 acres along Graham Mill creek prohibiting any future development.

State:

We have worked with MDOT to establish two new access points along highway 7. The southern intersection is nearly identical to Industrial park drive about a mile to the south. Our northern access is a 50 ft. wide driveway and access to the Equestrian Center.

We have worked with MDEQ to develop a low impact, environmentally friendly solution of constructed wetlands and subsurface drip fields to accommodate our sewer needs.

County: meeting next week to discuss approval process:

Phase One:

The northern area is 150 acres \pm /- including a 19 acre lake with 64 single family lots at approximately 2 acres each. The Town of Abbeville is extending their water association to serve this area.

The lower 100 acre area represents the main entrance into Oxford Springs consisting of a Commercial Center, Live-Work areas, Residential and outdoor gathering spaces for local events.

Finally, the Oxford Springs Equestrian Center, consisting of approximately 85 acres including a 20 stall stable and 40,000 square foot covered arena and will be accessed from our northern entrance of highway 7.
