Dr. Sandy Rogers presented an annual update from Communicare to The Board. No action was taken.





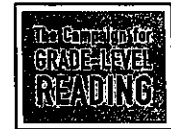

THE LAFAYETTE COUNTY-
OXFORD-UNIVERSITY COMMUNITY

Lafayette County-Oxford- University, Mississippi



The Lafayette County-Oxford-University (LOU) community is a strong vibrant community that values education. The community is home to the University of Mississippi and two successful public-school districts which serves as a draw for families to live and raise their children. The community values early childhood education and knows in order to be prosperous it must promote early literacy and reading on grade level by grade three. The LOU community has demonstrated its commitment to early literacy by forming a partnership focused on early childhood and reading development. Lafayette County School District, Oxford School District, the City of Oxford, and Lafayette County each contribute funding for a director who helps guide the LOU Reads coalition. Additional funds from the Family Resource Center help support bigger outcomes, a larger impact, and sustainable scale.

Reviewing data from the Mississippi Kindergarten Readiness Assessment, also known as MKAS2, revealed a need to strengthen early literacy efforts in existing early childhood programs to promote school readiness. LOU Reads, Lafayette County-Oxford Public Library, LOU Excel by 5, the University of Mississippi Center for Excellence in Literacy Instruction, and the school districts began partnering to provide opportunities for preschool and early childhood program teachers and teacher assistants to come together for literacy training and collaborative conversations. In order to add further value to the sessions, teachers and teacher assistants can count this time towards continuing education units. Sessions are proving to grow a strong learning network for early childhood providers between private child care centers, public preschool, and Head Start.

This initiative shows promise for a larger impact with plans to provide mobile learning opportunities. The partners are moving forward with a mobile literacy project that will use a school bus combined with the relationships built through teacher and teacher assistant training to serve the community. The mobile literacy project will provide a lab-based model using best practices by targeting neighborhoods and communities where Kindergarten Readiness Assessment results show pockets of students arriving in kindergarten classes unprepared. This project will allow for application-level training for early childhood staff and providers to promote bigger school readiness outcomes with LOU children.

The LOU community is moving beyond the walls of schools and early childhood programs to have a larger impact on school readiness. The community seeks to use its greatest resource, its people, to expand existing programs, to grow stronger alliances, and improve literacy rates among children. These efforts show a strong collaborative coalition with a focus on ensuring that all children are reading on grade level by the third grade.

Bright Spots showcase specific actions taken by Grade-Level Reading communities that contribute to success and help drive improvement. Bright Spots highlight innovative approaches and promising strategies for achieving bigger outcomes in school readiness, school attendance, summer learning, and grade-level reading.
