


**ORDER: APPROVE PAY SCHEDULE FOR RESOLUTION BOARD MEMBERS FOR

Lisa,

Would you please present the following to the Board of Supervisors at their October 5, 2020 meeting:

### **Suggested pay schedule for Resolution Board Members November 3, 2020 General Election (Seven Members)**

November 3 <sup>rd</sup> Election -	$\$150.00 \times 7 = \$1,050.00$
November 9 <sup>th</sup> (Final Count) -	$\$110.00 \times 3 = \$330.00$
November 24 <sup>th</sup> Runoff -	$\$110.00 \times 3 = \$330.00$
<b>TOTAL</b>	<b>\$1,710.00</b>

Justification: The Resolution Board will work an estimated 10 hours the day of the General Election processing absentees. This far exceeds the hours they work during most elections where they normally receive \$110.00 per day. They will not receive the hazard pay that other poll workers will receive on the General Election Day.

The November 9<sup>th</sup> date the Resolution Board will only be here for a short time that day as they will only be handling the mail that came in after the November 3<sup>rd</sup> Election. The runoff (if there is one) is expected to be a smaller number of voters and most likely they will be there less than an 8 hour period. Renumeration for the November 9<sup>th</sup> date and the runoff is planned to be \$110 per Resolution Board Member of which will be 3 members.
