C. PROGRAM GOALS FOR NEXT REPORTING PERIOD (November 2020 - January 2021)

Continued support of PreK classrooms in our Lafayette-Oxford-University Early Learning Collaborative (LOU ELC)- 23 classrooms

Recruit family members of LOU ELC PreK Classrooms for the Adult Education and Workforce Training Program. Currently, we have eight inquiries. Seven participants have interviews set-up with Zachary Antonelli to explore programs. Five participants are taking active steps toward registration at NWCC.

Examine Kindergarten MKAS² Fall Data to plan professional development for the LOU Community childcare centers and schools. We are in the process of examining this data, and tracing scores to prior PreK Programs. It is taking a little longer than normal because the testing window was extended.

Survey students, parents, and educators about the 2020 MS Reads One Book Project. We had 13 volunteers recruited to read chapters of Fenway and Hattie throughout the project. The author, Victoria Coe, interviewed with us about the project and was impressed with the work within the community. It was a huge success across the LOU Community.

Provide K-Readiness Backpacks to local childcare centers.

Continue partnership with Ole Miss Athletics and Coach Kermit Davis to implement Kermits Kids at Central Elementary, Della Davidson Elementary, and Lafayette Lower/Upper Elementary. It is a program that works in conjunction with the Accelerated Reader Program at each school. Kermits Kids will begin January 2021.

Partner with the School of Education to organize a series of book drives and subsequent distributions in the community of Marks, MS. Ole Miss Athletics will be teaming with the School of Ed to push efforts.

Plan Mind in the Making Trainings- These trainings will be in conjunction with our previous Parent Academy trainings.

Within the past three months, we have distributed nearly 100 books and 50 ArtZone packets through the Little Free Libraries. We will expand and enhance the Little Free Libraries in the LOU Community by adding two more and painting/repairing current ones. We have had six volunteers assisting in this project- many of them VISTAs in the area.

E. MKAS² PreK Results for Fall 2020

There is only a spring benchmark score for PreK students, which is a scale score of 498. Students in the LOU ELC are expected to have a minimum scale score of 498 or a gain of 98 scale score points.


Enrollment of the LOU ELC at the time of the beginning of the year assessment was 339 students. Eight virtual students' parents declined the assessment; therefore, 331 students were assessed.

During the 19-20 school year, 81% of our students scored below 498, and 19% scored above 498. The average scale score was 431.

This school year, 77% of our students scored below 498, and 23% scored above 498. The average scale score was 444.

NOTE: The number of students who are above and below the 498 scale score are not listed in order to protect their identity.
