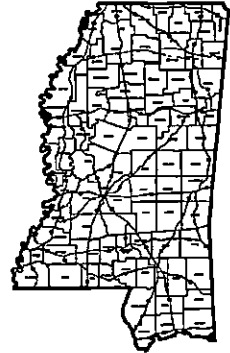

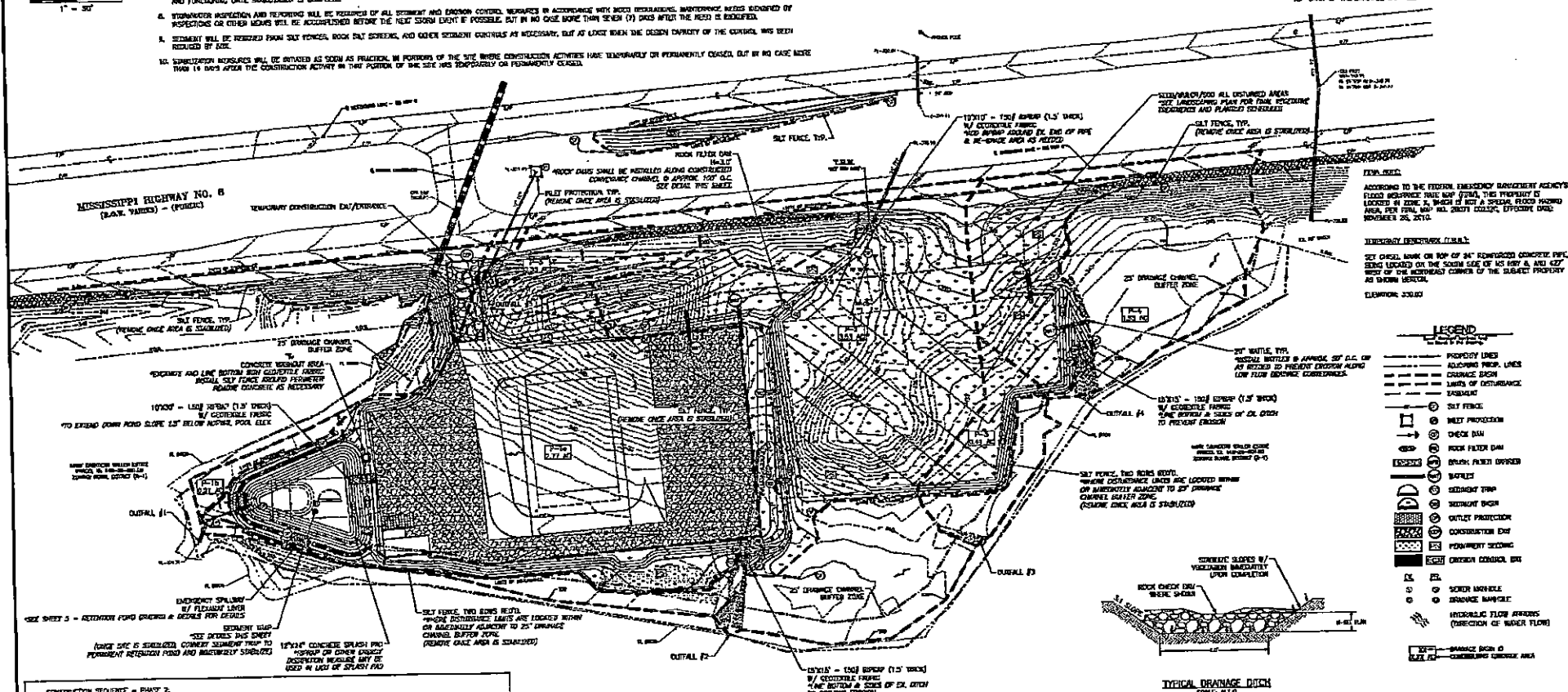
EROSION CONTROL MEASURES

1. THE CONTRACTOR SHALL PROVIDE AND MAINTAIN EROSION CONTROL DURING CONSTRUCTION BY THE PLACEMENT OF SILT FENCES OR BATTLES WHERE NECESSARY TO PREVENT EXCESSIVE EROSION OF ANY LOTTERIES, PAVES, DRAINAGE STRUCTURES, OR ADJACENT PROPERTIES. THE CONTRACTOR SHALL PROVIDE ANY ADDITIONAL EROSION CONTROL AS ORDERED BY THE ENGINEER.
2. ONCE CONSTRUCTION BEGINS, WEEKLY INSPECTIONS (ADVISORY TO HOLD) SHALL BE PERFORMED BY A CERTIFIED EROSION CONTROL INSPECTOR.
3. ALL NEW CUT OR FILL AREAS LACKING ADJACENT VEGETATION SHALL BE FERTILIZED, MULCHED, SEEDING, AND/OR SOODED AS REQUIRED TO EFFECTIVELY CONTROL SOIL EROSION.
4. TOTAL DISTURBED AREA IS APPROXIMATELY 8.54 ACRES.
5. DURING EROSION CONTROL PHASE OF SLOPE STABILIZATION, BATTLES WITH SILT FENCE BACKING SHALL BE REQUIRED TO ELIMINATE SEDIMENT TRANSFER INTO ADJACENT LANDSCAPES PROPERTY AND PUBLIC STREETS.
6. EXISTING STREAMBED CORRELATION SHALL BE PROTECTED FROM SLIDING/EROSION AND UNDISTURBED DURING THE INITIAL PHASE OF CONSTRUCTION. ONCE GRADING OF NEW CONVEYANCE CHANNEL IS COMPLETE, CHANNEL SHALL BE IMMEDIATELY STABILIZED BY SEEDING AND MULCHING. ADDITIONAL EROSION CONTROL MEASURES SHALL BE REQUIRED AS NEEDED OR AS ORDERED BY THE ENGINEER OR NCEM.
7. ALL DISTURBED AREAS SHALL BE PERMANENTLY STABILIZED WITH SEEDING/MULCH AND SEGMENT TRAP SHALL BE PROPERLY MAINTAINED. DESIGNED EROSION CONTROL MEASURES MUST REMAIN IN PLACE UNTIL STABILIZATION IS COMPLETE.
8. STORMWATER INSPECTION AND REPORTING WILL BE REQUIRED OF ALL EROSION CONTROL MEASURES IN ACCORDANCE WITH NCEM REGULATIONS. MAINTENANCE NOTES IDENTIFIED BY INSPECTIONS OR OTHER MEANS WILL BE ACCOMPLISHED BEFORE THE NEXT STORM EVENT IF POSSIBLE, BUT IN NO CASE MORE THAN SEVEN (7) DAYS AFTER THE EROSION IS IDENTIFIED.
9. SEGMENT TRAP WILL BE REQUIRED FROM SILT FENCES, ROCK BAT SCREENS, AND OTHER SEDIMENT CONTROLS AS NECESSARY, BUT AT LEAST WHEN THE DESIGN CAPACITY OF THE CONTROL HAS BEEN REDUCED BY 50%.
10. STABILIZATION MEASURES WILL BE INITIATED AS SOON AS PRACTICAL, IN PORTIONS OF THE SITE WHERE CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES HAVE TEMPORARILY OR PERMANENTLY CEASED, BUT IN NO CASE MORE THAN 14 DAYS AFTER THE CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITY IN THAT PORTION OF THE SITE HAS TEMPORARILY OR PERMANENTLY CEASED.



TEMPORARY CHANNEL EROSION NOTES:

1. NO SPILL PILES ARE TO BE DISCHARGED INTO BUFFER ZONE LOTS.
2. THE CONVEYANCE CHANNEL AND/OR BUFFER ZONE WILL BE PROTECTED WITH TWO ROWS OF SILT FENCE WITH BATTLE BACKING AT ALL TIMES.
3. ALL AREAS TO BE DISTURBED WITHIN THE 25' BUFFER ZONE WILL BE STABILIZED IMMEDIATELY UPON COMPLETION.
4. NO STEPS ARE TO BE REMOVED AND THE ORIGINAL AMOUNT OF CLEARING AND CHALKING SHALL BE PERFORMED WITHIN THE 25' BUFFER ZONE.
5. ANY STORMWATER NOT DRAINING TO THE PROPOSED SEDIMENT TRAP AND DRAINING TO EXISTING CHANNELS SHALL BE LIMITED TO UNDISTURBED AREAS AND EVERY ATTEMPT SHALL BE MADE TO ELIMINATE THE CHALKING OF STORMWATER TO ALLOW MINIMUM POSSIBLE LOSS OF CONCENTRATED OILS AND GREASES IN WETLANDS, FLOODPLAIN, VEGETATION, AND DIVERSION OF DISCHARGE.
6. THE BUFFER ZONE OF SILT FENCE SHALL BE A MINIMUM OF 5' FROM THE TOP BANK OF THE DRAINAGE CHANNEL.

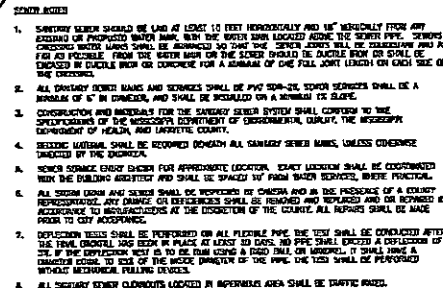

1. MAINTAIN ALL EROSION CONTROL MEASURES AS NECESSARY.
 2. BEGIN EROSION CONTROL ACTIVITIES AS SHOWN ON THESE PLANS, AND INSTALL ALL STORMWATER PIPING AND STRUCTURES.
 3. INSTALL ROCK CHECK DAMS AND BATTLE DITCH CHECKS AS SHOWN AND IMMEDIATELY FOLLOWING GRADING OF DRAINAGE CONVEYANCES.
 4. INSTALL RUST PROTECTION MEASURES WHERE SHOWN.
 5. INSTALL ALL UNDERGROUND UTILITIES, FERTILIZER, SEEDING, AND OTHER WATER-PROOFING TREATMENT SYSTEM AS PER UTILITY PLANS.

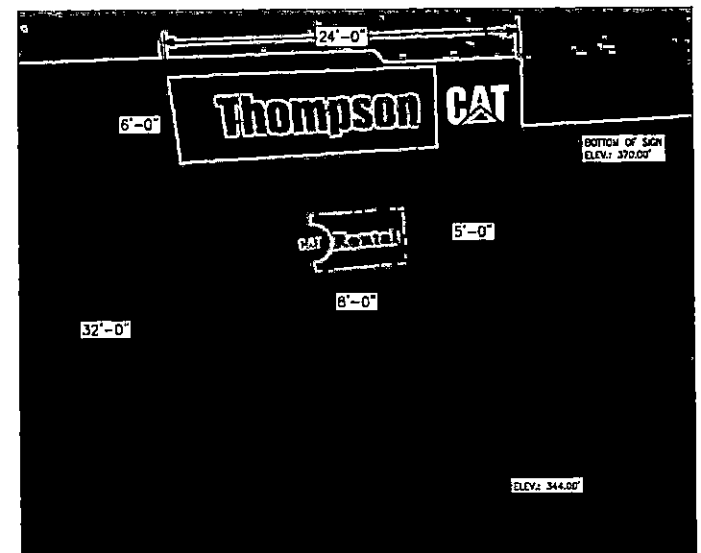


MONUMENT SIGN (DETAIL)

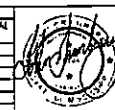

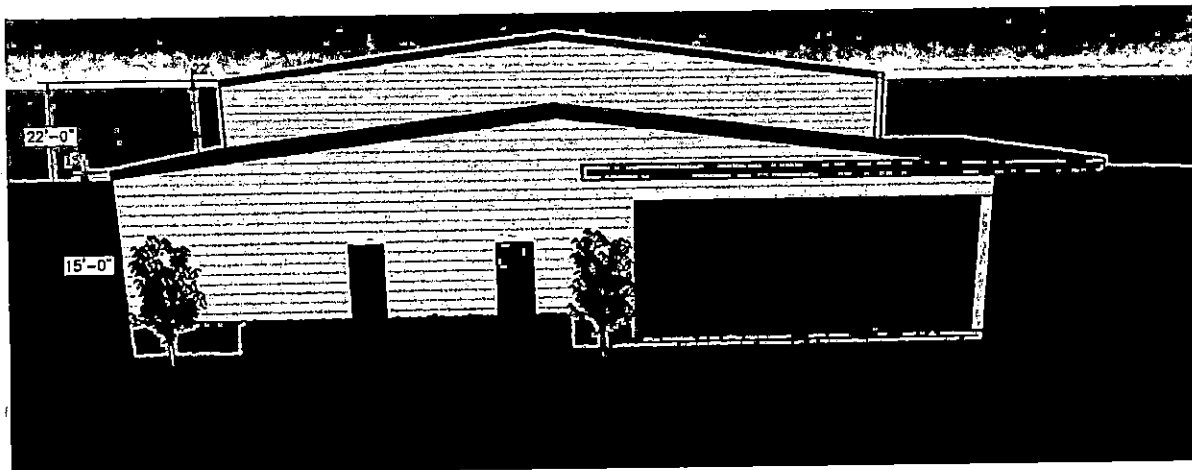

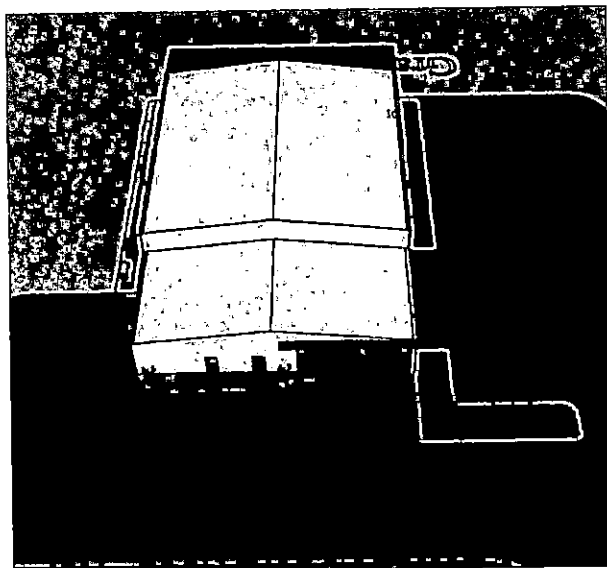
