The vote on the motion was as follows:

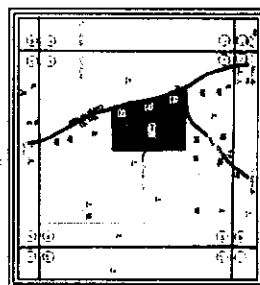
Supervisor Brent Larson, voted yes

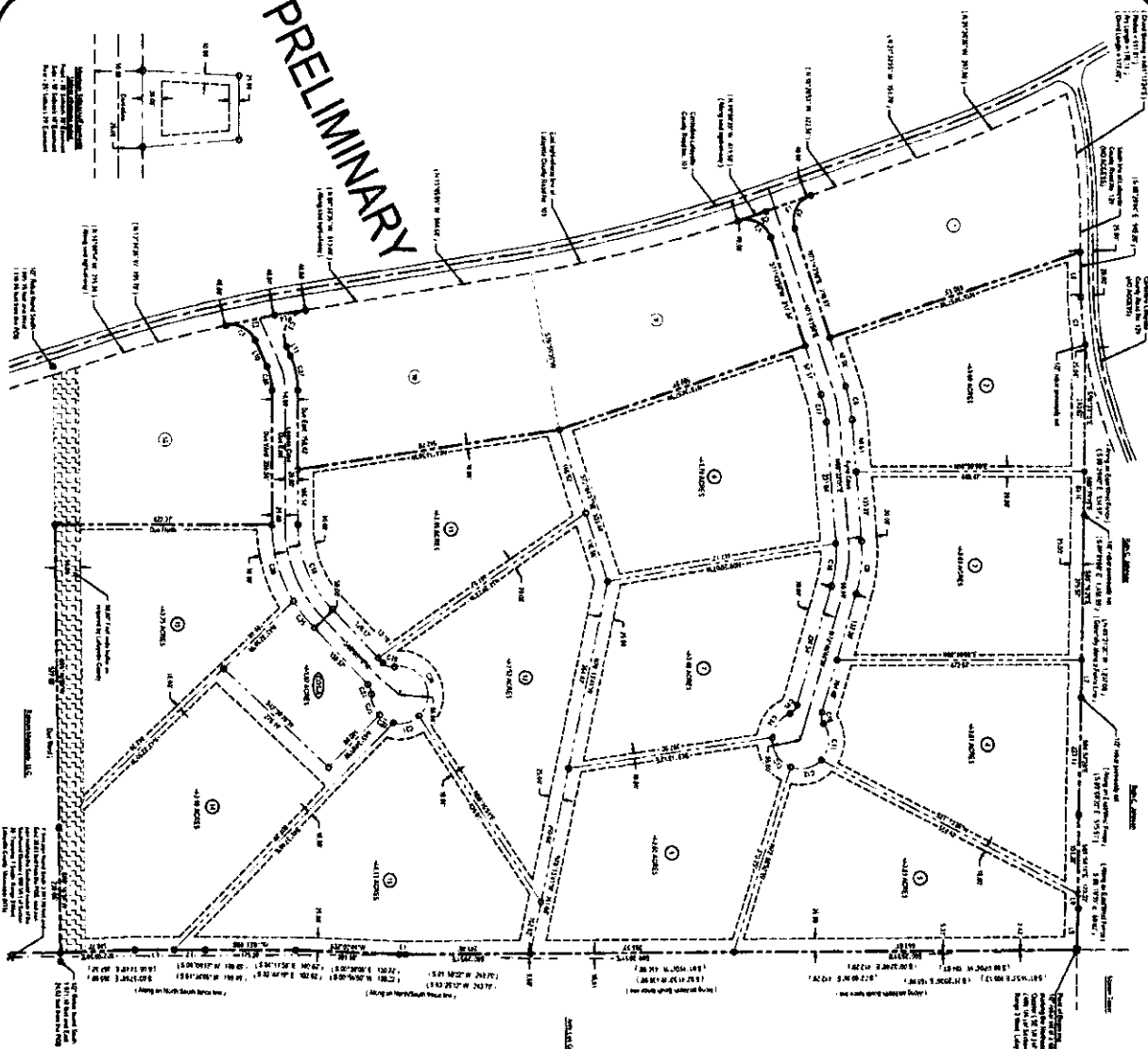

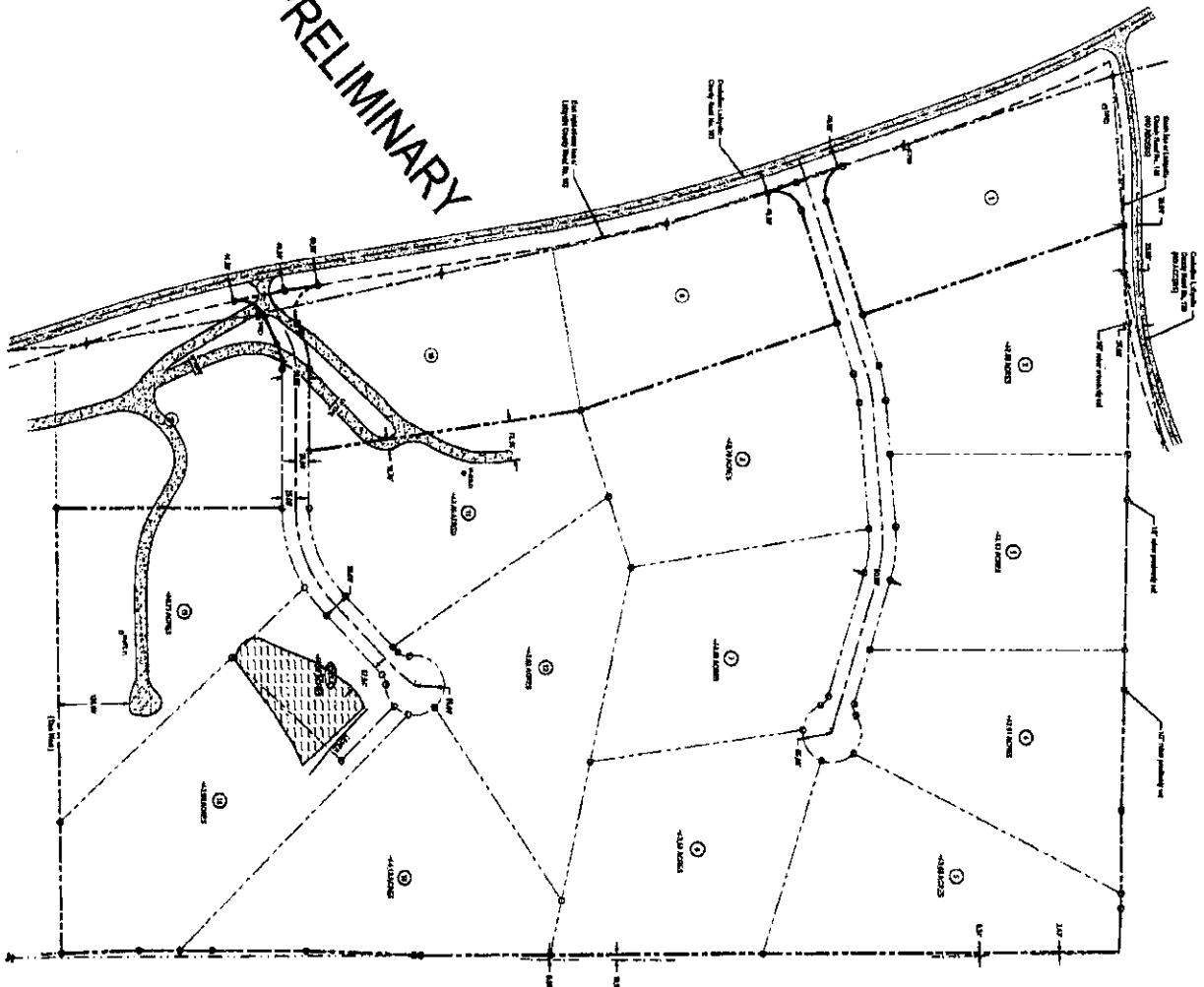

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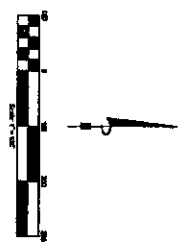
