INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN LAFAYETTE COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI AND THE TOWN OF TAYLOR, MISSISSIPPI

This Agreement is made on the 5 day of November, 2024 by the Board of Supervisors of Lafayette County, Mississippi ("County") and by the Town of Taylor, Mississippi ("Taylor"), and is set forth as follows:

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Lafayette County, Mississippi, as the duly elected governing body of said County, has the authority and obligation to adequately promote the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of Lafayette County, Mississippi pursuant to Miss. Code Ann. §19-3-41; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Taylor has the duty to adequately promote the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of Taylor and, thus, has adopted fire codes in aid of the public welfare and the benefit of its citizens, pursuant to Miss. Code Ann. §21-19-25; and

WHEREAS, Taylor has made written request, duly approved, to the Lafayette County Board of Supervisors for assistance in administering and making inspections for conformance to such fire codes by individuals duly trained and licensed to perform said inspections within Taylor in accordance and pursuant to the authority granted under Miss. Code Ann. §17-2-5, and the County has entered an order approving said request by order duly entered on its minutes, subject to the terms of an interlocal agreement; and

WHEREAS, the County and Taylor have agreed to enter into this interlocal agreement in order to further define the scope and mutual duties and obligations between them with regard to the proposed fire code inspection services to be provided by the County to Taylor.

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements contained herein and pursuant to the authority of Miss. Code Ann. §17-13-1, et seq., as amended, the Board of Supervisors of Lafayette County, Mississippi and the Board of Aldermen of the Town of Taylor, Mississippi, do hereby agree as follows:

- 1. **EFFECTIVE DATE**: This agreement shall take effect upon the day of approval by the Attorney General of the State of Mississippi. This agreement may be modified only by mutual agreement of the parties hereto; however, any modification of this agreement must be approved by the Attorney General prior to the implementation of any such modification.
- 2. **PURPOSE**: The Board of Supervisors of Lafayette County, Mississippi does hereby agree to provide fire code inspection services for Taylor consistent with the Lafayette County fire code.
- 3. **FINANCING, STAFFING and SUPPLYING:** Duly authorized representatives of the Lafayette County Fire Department shall have the authority to participate and provide feedback in site plan review meetings conducted by the Town of Taylor, provide fire code inspections for structures located in the Town of Taylor in accordance with the applicable codes, and to otherwise advise on issues relating to

compliance with the fire code. The Lafayette County Fire Department will charge fees in accordance with the attached fee schedule (Exhibit A), and said fees will be payable to Lafayette County, Mississippi.

- 4. **<u>DURATION</u>**: This agreement shall be in force and effect upon the approval of the Attorney General of the State of Mississippi and shall terminate upon ninety (90) days written notice by either party to this agreement.
- 5. ORGANIZATION: STATUTORY AUTHORITY: This Interlocal Agreement does not establish a separate organizational structure or entity, and the purpose of this interlocal Agreement is to establish the agreement of the Board of Supervisors of Lafayette County, Mississippi to provide a system of fire code inspections for and on behalf of the Town of Taylor whereby the County will provide duly qualified inspectors familiar with the building and fire codes adopted by Lafayette County and the Town of Taylor. The County and Taylor are authorized by Miss. Code Ann. §17-2-5 to carry out the agreed duties and responsibilities set forth herein.
- 6. **SUBMISSION OF AGREEMENT**: This agreement shall be submitted to the Attorney General of the State of Mississippi for approval and shall thereafter be filed for record with the Chancery Clerk of Lafayette County, Mississippi, a copy of which shall be filed with the Secretary of State within sixty (60) days after it takes effect.

Fire Inspection and Plan Review Fee Policy

Fire Inspection and plan review fees shall be paid to the Lafayette County Fire Department. Contractors and/or property owners must notify the Department that new installations, construction, alterations or renovations are complete and give the Department 48 hours' notice of the requested final inspection. The fee schedule shall be as follows:

Final Fire Inspection	\$50.00
Hood Suppression System	\$100.00
Fire Alarm System	\$100.00
Sprinkler System	\$100.00
Elevator Inspection	\$100.00
Plan Review	\$200.00

If any inspection fails or the property is not ready for the requested inspection at the scheduled time, the fee will double for the reinspect. For example, a general office building will pay \$50.00 for a final inspection and schedule said inspection. If the property is not ready for the inspection at that date time or fails for any reason, the contractor or owner will pay \$100.00 for a second inspection. If a third inspection is required, the fee will be \$200.00

Annual fire inspections will be conducted at no charge to the business, unless the occupancy requires more frequent inspections. For example, if a daycare or adult daycare requires a Health Department Fire Inspection that does not coincide with Lafayette County's regularly scheduled annual, a \$50.00 fee will paid before the inspection will be conducted.
