


**ORDER: APPROVE TEMPORARY CONSTRUCTION EASEMENT AGREEMENT


The vote on the motion was as follows:

Authorize a temporary construction easement to enter private property on Lafayette County parcel 192Y-09-112.01 to perform work associated with the Stormwater Mitigation Grant. (Joel Hollowell)

The proposed temporary construction easement will allow Lafayette County's contractor, Custom Dirt and Drainage, to enter private property at The Lakes subdivision to perform work associated with our Stormwater Mitigation Grant. This particular project is the regrading and armoring of the Rock Springs Lake emergency spillway that has eroded multiple times during heavy rain events putting Lafayette County Road 415 in danger. Due to the concern that the erosion of the emergency spillway could cause a catastrophic failure of the Rock Springs Lake dam, which would likely destroy CR 415, Lafayette County has repaired the spillway on a couple of occasions. The proposed work would prevent future erosion and the need for continual repairs.
