IN COMPLIANCE WITH THE MANDATES OF SENATE BILL NO. 2380, IT IS THEREFOR
ORDERED AND ADJUDGED AS FOLLOW:

- 1) That the salary of the Lindsey M. Hopkins Victim Assistance Coordinator for July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2023 shall be \$63,00.00, pursuant to Miss Code Ann 25-31-10 (5) as amended by Mississippi SB2066.
- 2) The counties of the Third Judicial District, to wit: Marshall, Lafayette, Chickasaw, Union, Tippah, Benton, and Calhoun, shall pay the salary, fringe benefits and expenses of the "Victim Assistance Coordinator:" as hereinafter directed.
- 3) The salary, fringe benefits and expenses and all other line items as set forth in above proposed budget for the Victim/Witness Program shall be paid pro-rata in the following percentages:

Following Percentages:

Lafayette	30%
Marshall	19%
Union	16%
Chickasaw	13%
Calhoun	9%
Tippah	8%
Benton	5%

- 4) Lafayette County, Mississippi, is hereby re-designated as lead county, and such shall make, draw and deliver to the "Victim Assistance Coordinator" at the end of each month without Further order from this Court, in the hereinafter directed manner.
 - (a) Lafayette County, after paying the salary, fringe benefits and expenses of the "Victims Assistance Coordinator" shall immediately thereafter bill each of the other seven counties pro-rata part of the salary, and hospitalization premiums of the "Victim Assistance Coordinator," in the percentages herein above set forth; travel expenses will be the amount stated each month as actual travel, conference, training and meals per county, hereby ordered and directed forthwith thereafter to reimburse Lafayette County, Mississippi, in the amount stated to each of the said counties according to the provisions of this Order set forth above.
 - (b) Any other necessary expenditure for the implementation maintenance and administration of the Victim/Witness shall be supported by written order of the Court. Lafayette County shall

be lead county, and such shall when ordered by the Court, make issue, and deliver to the Office of the District Attorney, a check or warrant for said necessary expenditures. Lafayette county shall in turn bill each of the other counties for its pro rata share of said expenditures according to the percentages set forth above; and the other six counties are ordered and directed forthwith reimburse Lafayette County accordingly.


