I am pleased to inform you that the subject project has been approved for \$132,200.00 with a federal share of \$99,150.00 (75%) and a Non-Federal share of \$33,050.00 to be paid by Lafayette County.

The following is the approved Scope of Work (SOW) for the above-referenced project:

Lafayette County will install a prefabricated 48'x10'x8' above-ground saferoom on a 12" thick foundation. The community safe room, with an occupancy of 75 persons, will be equipped with a chemical toilet and handwashing station and will be ADA compliant with two handicap accessible doors. In compliance with FEMA 361 standards, the pefabricated safe room will be rated for winds up to 250 mph. The safe room, installed at the Lafayette County Business Center, will be for employees and patrons visiting the center and for the continuity of government.
